# Week beginning 29th June

There are four areas I would like you to focus on: Literacy, Phonics, Maths and Understanding the World. The red writing relates to all the documents uploaded.

### <u>Literacy:</u>

This year the children really loved a book called 'Dear Zoo' by Rod Campbell. This week I would like the children to read this book and then retell the story using puppets or the sequencing cards (Literacy - Colour Sticks Puppets/ Literacy - Sequencing Pictures).

### Phonics:

Introduce the new sound 'F', like 'ffffffff, flower'. I have made some flipcharts to help your child name some objects that begin with the 'F' sound and to form the grapheme correctly. (Documents uploaded: Sound F Write/ Sound F Words) Please practise the other sounds too. I have prepared another worksheet for the children to practise initial sound (Phonics - Initial Sounds 3) and I have uploaded a powerpoint too. (Phonics - Powerpoint Initial Sounds) See below a video of Alphabet yoga that we used in Nursery as part of exercise/ phonics session. ### <u>Maths:</u>

I would like your child to work on number recognition to 10 and matching numerals to quantities. I have uploaded a few activities (with pictorials) that you can use or you can work with concrete objects and let them write the number or a mix of the two.
