This Sunday, the Church celebrates the great feast of Corpus Christi [two Latin words which mean 'the Body of Christ']. This is traditionally a time when children make their First Holy Communion.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus offers the gift of himself to his listeners in the synagogue. The disciples would have been shocked - Jesus was offering to nourish them with his life.

Today, Jesus wants us to experience the fullness of life here, and to lead us into the joys of everlasting life. He wants to strengthen and to nourish each one of us - he is the Bread of Life.

THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 14th JUNE 2020



Jesus said, "I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Those who eat this bread will live forever. Now the bread which I will give is my flesh, and I will give my flesh for the life of the world. Those

who eat the bread which is my flesh have eternal life now, and I will raise them up on the last day. My flesh is true food; my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood live in me and I live in them. So my flesh is the bread which comes down from heaven. It is not like the bread which our ancestors once ate in the desert - they died, but those who eat this bread will live forever."




Our Special Time Together

Wednesday's Word is ...

NOURISH Loving God & Each Other

With Jesus' love we will always be nourished. Ask your child what the word 'nourish' means to them. Then, each of you talk about something, other than food, that nourishes you and helps you grow. Perhaps it is: a special friendship; your faith; being praised; praying; a hobby or sport; the Church and the sacraments; the love and care you receive. Who gives you these things?

Let's give thanks to Jesus - the Bread of Life! Who else should we remember to thank in this coming week for nourishing us (e.g. parents, carers, teachers, priests, grandparents or friends)? Which people can we nourish in this coming week and how can we nourish them? Perhaps we can: encourage someone; give something to a food bank or a local charity; help and offer hope to others. For tonight's closing prayer, why not slowly say the 'Our Father' together (see below)?

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.
