The importance of prayer

Prayer is the most important part of a Muslim's day, they pray five times every day: early morning, midday, afternoon, after sunset, and nightfall. Muslims can pray anywhere that is clean and quiet. Before they pray they take off their shoes, cover their heads, wash, that is called wudu, and roll out their prayer mat to face Makkah the holy city for Muslims. Many Muslims carry a special compass with them which helps them find the direction of Makkah.

There are nine movements in their prayer including standing, kneeling and bowing low, and touching the ground with foreheads. This is to show that they are humble and respectful to Allah.

There is a set pattern to prayer which includes a special praise and thanks to Allah, asking forgiveness for their sins and asking for their needs. The first words of the prayer is Allah Akbar meaning Allah is great. When they have finished the set prayers they can use their own words.
