The Taj Mahal is an extravagant tomb built in 1632.


It is in Agra, India which is in the continent of Asia.

The Taj Mahal was commissioned by Emperor Shah Jahan to house the remains of his wife Mumtaz Mahal. Mumtaz died while giving birth to the couple's 14th child and Shah was so heartbroken he immediately began planning the most elaborate tomb he could make for her.




The Central Building

The central building is made of white marble mined from Northern India and inlaid with 28 types of precious and semi precious jewels, such as jade from China, lapis lazuli from Afghanistan and sapphire from Sri Lanka. These glimmer when you shine a torch against them.



The Garden and Reflective Pool

The Taj Mahal's design was influenced by Persian, Indian and Islamic cultures. The focus was on geometric patterns and symmetry, which the gardens and reflective pool demonstrate beautifully.



The Cost of the Taj Mahal

The Taj Mahal took 12 years, 20,000 workers and 1,000 elephants to build.

The estimated cost at the time it was built was 32 million rupees, which converts to 70 million pounds today!
