## Holy Communion



The people respond "Amen!" The Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion holds up the Chalice and says, "The Blood of Christ." and the people respond "Amen!"







In the Eucharistic Prayer the priest does what Jesus did at the Last Supper.

'Take this, all of you, and eat of it: For this is my body.'





'This is the chalice of my blood.'
'Do this in memory of me.'



## Holy Communion

Anyone who has not made their First Holy Communion can go up for a blessing. Notice the little girl with her hands crossed who is going to receive a blessing.

Afterwards, people return to their benches and in their hearts, say "Thank you!" to Jesus and enjoy being very close to him in this special way.

- After the Eucharistic Prayer, said by the priest, the bread is called the Host because it is now the Body of Christ.
- The cup holding the wine, which is now the blood of Christ, is called the Chalice.
- Extra Ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are people from the parish who administer Holy Communion in church and take Holy Communion to the housebound.
