The four Gospels are found in the second part of the Bible, the New Testament.

The Gospels tell the story of Jesus' life on earth, his birth, his teaching, the friends he called to help him and his Death and Resurrection.

There are four Gospels, each named after the person who is thought to have written it: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.



**M**atthew, Mark, Luke and John each tell the story of the Good News of Jesus.

**M**atthew tells us about Joseph and wise men from the East who came to see the baby. Matthew reminds us that Jesus teaches us how to live with God who is always with us.

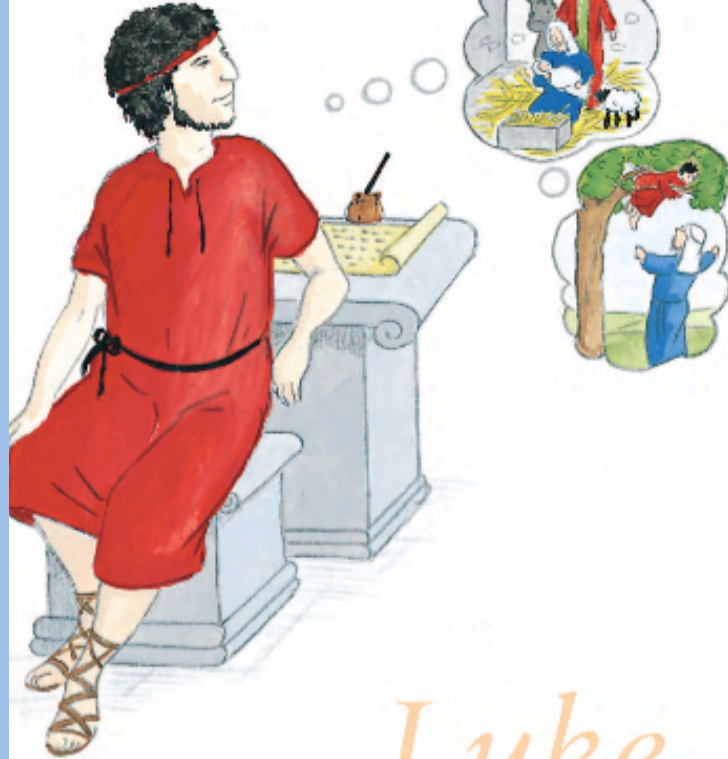

# Mark





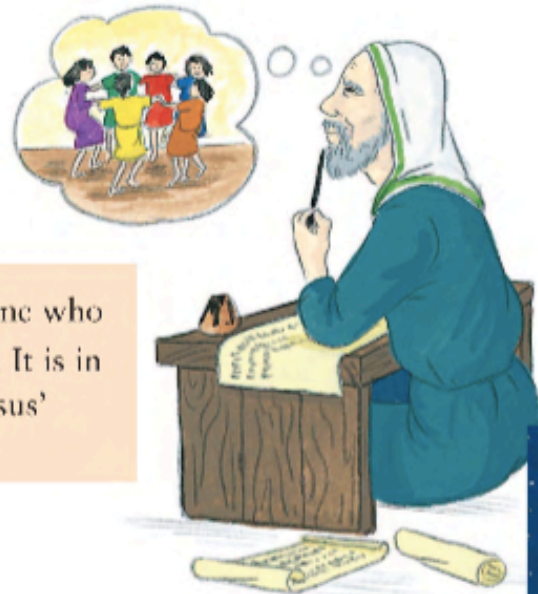
**L**uke tells the stories of Mary, of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem and the shepherds who came to see the child.


